



2021 QUEENSLAND CHAPTER STATE AEROBATIC COMPETITION

1. **Venue**

The State Titles will be held at Watts Bridge Memorial Airfield Queensland Saturday 1 May- to Sunday 2 May 2021 inclusive with an organised practice day on Friday 30 April.

2. **Contest Entry**

All members of the Australian Aerobatic Club and State Chapters are eligible to compete. It is a requirement that all Unlimited, Advanced and Intermediate pilots must have completed the Judges Home Study Course or Chapter Run Judges Course and be prepared to judge at the competition to be eligible to compete.

AAC Regulations 2020 Annexe 2B – Pilot and Aircraft Registration Checklist.

Pilot Documentation Checklist	
1	Entry Forms and waiver signed and entry fee paid
2	Free sequences in "seq" format. (The Qld Chapter also requires the sequence be submitted in "pdf" format. Closing date 23 April 2021.
3	Current member of an AAC Chapter for State contests and also the AAC for National contests, in accordance with local chapter rules
4	Current Pilot's License
5	Current aviation medical. A Class 1 Medical or Class 2 Medical is required.
6	Current aeroplane flight review.
7	Low level endorsement appropriate to the competition level being flown. Refer to paragraph 2.52 for the applicable height limitation for each category. Refer to paragraph 2.16 if a pilot does not hold the endorsement appropriate to the competition level being flown.
8	Aerobatic Flight Activity endorsement suitable for the intended category of competition.
9	Spinning flight activity endorsement.
10	Competitor's next of kin recorded.

Aircraft Documentation Checklist	
1	Certificate of registration
2	Certificate of airworthiness.
3	Current maintenance release
4	Certificate of insurance detailing public liability and property damage in the amount of \$5,000,000 single limit minimum and annotated for aerobatic competition.

6. Briefing

The first competition briefing will be held at 0745 hours Saturday 1 April 2021. Subsequent briefings will be held on each contest day at 0745 hours.

Competitors who fail to attend the competition briefings may be disqualified for that day's flight. Competitors who arrive late will be penalised.

All Officials and Judges are required to attend the briefings.

Competitors wishing to practice on site prior to the first briefing on Friday 30 April 2021 must advise secretary@aacqld.com.au. Practice before Friday will be at the competitors' own choice and their responsibility to ensure correct procedures are followed.

7. Contest Rules

The contest will be conducted according to the rules of the Australian Aerobatic Club.

CIVA Rules will govern Unlimited, Advanced and Intermediate category competition with the exception of the height limits for Intermediate. The height limits for Intermediate will be Upper Limit 3900 feet and Lower Limit 1000 feet. AAC 2020 rules 2.52.

Some rules may need to be amended to cater for the limited competition days.

8. Practice

Official Practice starts on Friday 30 April 2021 after the 0800 hours briefing and will end 15 minutes before End of Daylight (EOD).

Competitors will not be permitted to fly other than during the practice or competition after 0800 hours on Friday 30 April 2021.

Competitors who arrive after the Friday briefing will not be permitted to practice before being briefed by either the Contest Director or Chief Judge.

10. Fuel and Oil

Watts Bridge airfield has a fuel bowser that requires either a Visa or Mastercard to purchase fuel.

Limited oil can be purchased at the clubhouse.

11 Hangarage

Limited hangarage is available. Please complete the Hangarage form on the web site. Hangarage fees will be \$10.00 per night per aircraft and payable in advance to the AAC Queensland Chapter. Please note this is on a 'first come first served' basis.

12 Accommodation

It is each participant's responsibility to book his or her own accommodation.

Caravans and Campervans may be parked near the AAC Queensland Chapter Clubhouse in a designated area. Tents may also be set-up in this area.

The camping fee with access to power is \$20 per site per night and without power \$10 per site per night.

Accommodation can be booked at either Esk or Toogoolawah, as Watts Bridge is about half-way between both (10/15 minute drive in either direction).
